Pupil Premium Allocation and Priorities 2016-17

Pupil premium is an additional funding provided to all schools for supporting certain pupils to ensure they benefit from the same opportunities as all other children. There are three categories of children that qualify for Pupil Premium:

- Children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- Looked after children
- Armed forces children

The school has identified needs both at school level and within classrooms for individual children. The school has a programme of targeted intervention to meet those needs. Beyond this, the school has established the following areas as key spending priorities:

Key Objectives in PPG Spending
1. To ensure all children are making the expected level of progress in reading, maths and writing and that the contextual gap is closing and where it is not, action is taken to meet the needs of all pupils.
2. Maintain the existing level of provision for disadvantaged pupils.

Specific Areas of Action
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Interventions are timely and have significant impact on learning to ensure all children's needs are met.• Provision of additional support by teachers and/or teaching assistants outside core lessons for intervention programmes• Focus on mathematics proficiency• Improve standards in writing• Engage pupils/parents in reading, maths, writing, homework and curriculum evenings.• Provide additional after school interventions.

These investments represent a minor subset of our overall spend on targeted needs and spending in the current year (as with previous years) is planned to exceed the allocation provided. The review of this spending will be posted at the end of the academic year.
